Help Geraldine Chacón

Geraldine Chacón grew up wanting to protect the rights of everyone. She dreamed of being a lawyer when she was 9. At 14, she wanted to be a leader in her city's youth organization. And at university, she started a network of Amnesty International activists pushing for change. Her mother says "Any injustice she saw, she fought against."

This passion inspired Geraldine to help young people in some of the poorest areas of Caracas, her home city. But in February 2018, armed men arrested her. They claimed that she belonged to a group that organizes violent protests against the government. That wasn't true. Yet they kept her in jail for four months.

Geraldine is back home now but she is not allowed to leave Venezuela and she could be arrested again at any time for no reason. Peaceful activists like Geraldine are bullied every day to try to make them stop speaking up for change.

Ask Venezuela to stop bullying Geraldine now.

- ◆ Start your message with Dear Attorney General.
- ◆ Tell him who you are and that you don't want Geraldine Chacón to be treated badly again.
- ◆ Ask him to support her work to protect the rights of young people.
